

#### History of Needle and Syringe Programs

- Est. in Australia in 1986 in response to the risk of HIV associated with people who inject drugs
- BBV focus sustained by prevalence of hepatitis C.
- Fixed-site, outreach, secure dispensing units (SDUs).
- In June 2020:
  - 104 primary
  - o 811 secondary NSPs
  - 2,867 pharmacy NSPs
  - 377 Secure Dispensing Units (SDUs)
- 2019/20, 57.8 million needles and syringes were distributed in Australia to an estimated 75,756 regular PWID in Australia.




# National policy framework: NSPs and Harm Minimisation





#### The role of NSPs



A confidential and anonymous service that provides:

- Sterile injecting equipment (needles, syringes and disposal container).
- Safer sex products.
- Information on keeping healthy and reducing the health risks of injecting.
- A location for the return of used needles and syringes, including where possible, facilities for 24hour disposal.



#### **Objectives for NSP**

### To increase access to sterile injecting equipment to eliminate the reusing or sharing of equipment


- One of the most successful and cost-effective public health strategies ever implemented in Australia
- Estimated that for every dollar invested in NSPs, \$4 are returned in health care cost services in the short term
- Reducing BBV transmission and keeping the viral load low in the community
- Early intervention opportunity— referrals to multiple services
- Keeping people as healthy and connected as possible
- Support and care



# Victorian NSP Policy framework and practice guidelines

- Department of Health Guidelines currently under review
- Guidelines link with legislation:
  - Drugs Poisons and Controlled Substances Amendment Act 2021 (decriminalised secondary NSP supply)
- Guidelines link with organisational policy & procedure:
  - Know the scope of your organisation's practice
  - Know the service linkages within your catchment
  - OHS and needle stick injury incident reporting
  - Processes for ordering stock (Mailforce)
  - Processes for data collection (new NSP portal launched 1 Oct 2022)
