Hepatitis B & Hepatitis C:

1) **GVH Hepatitis Clinic (Graham St)**


E-mail referral (with provider number) to GVH Specialist Consulting Clinics

2) **GVH Community Sexual Health Clinic (Corio St)**

E-mail referral / details to Suzanne.wallis@gvhealth.org.au (no provider number needed), Patient can walk in to Corio St clinic Mon-Fri 9am-4pm

3) **For Hepatitis C, local GP**

A handful of GPs in GVH catchment treat Hepatitis C themselves
Always worth checking if the patient's GP does

FYI: Who to test for BBVs

National testing guidelines - see (<http://testingportal.ashm.org.au/>) for full details. Eligibility for testing for each BBV vary. In general, BBV testing should be considered where the following risk factors are present:

- Overseas born
- Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
- Men who have sex with men
- History of injecting drug use
- History of incarceration
- Sexual partner with a BBV
- Non sterile tattoos
- Medical/Dental procedures or sex overseas
