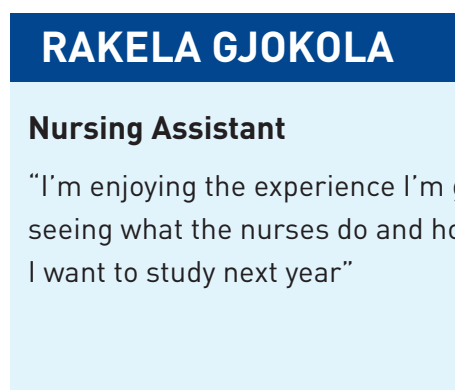
“I am planning to study nursing at university next year so the experience at GV Health is giving me a foot in the door before doing uni and placements so I’m not going in blind.”
