This program is for providers who want to improve the mental health care for their patients. Led by Dr Vibhay Raykar (Infant and Child Psychiatrist) and Dr Raju Lakshmana (Perinatal Psychiatrist) and facilitated by GV Health perinatal and child mental health specialists, the program is designed to expand the capacity to care for mental health in the Goulburn Valley region. One hour sessions include a brief education session by a specialist in the field, followed by a case presentation and discussion.
