The Interns will rotate through various clinical departments throughout 2027.

About GV Health

GV Health is located in Shepparton in central Victoria and is just 2-hours' drive north of Melbourne with proximity to alpine snowfields, rivers and lakes, wineries and the arts.

We are co-located next to the University of Melbourne Rural Medical School, and are working to be a centre of excellence for clinical teaching and research. If you come to us as an Intern, you join the GV Doctors community, and we will partner with you to prioritise your clinical rotation preferences to ensure you meet your career goals.

Application guidelines for 2027 Intern positions

The 2026 Victorian Intern Match is approaching, with changes to the Victorian Intern Allocation. PMCV aims to support candidates and health services through an equitable and efficient matching process.

An Intern Match Review Reference Group was established to optimise the process. Following consultation, an optimised ballot system for some eligibility groups in the Victorian Intern Allocation was decided to ensure the best outcomes for interns and health services.

Victorian Rural Preferential Allocation

The Victorian Rural Preferential Allocation (VRPA) process will continue under the Merit System, so that the rural health services can assess and select candidates most suitable for their internship programs

Stage 1

Candidates complete their application via the PMV APS. Applications will include:

- Personalised Cover Letter to GV Health
- Curriculum Vitae
- Completed Referee Reports
- Video Interview

Stage 2

The health services will review and rank candidates by the specified date in the key dates.

Stage 3

The allocation of VRPA positions will be run utilising a merit algorithm.

Victorian Intern Allocation

Eligibility Groups 1-3

Differently, the Victorian Intern Allocation (which features all metropolitan positions) will be held within an optimised ballot system for Eligibility Groups 1-3.

Stage 1

Candidates complete their application via the PMV APS. Applications will include:

- Curriculum Vitae
- Completed Referee Reports

Stage 2

The allocation will be run utilising an optimised ballot algorithm.

Stage 3

GV Health will receive a list of the accepted candidates at the end of each audit period, as specified in the key dates.



Eligibility Group 4

For those eligible for Eligibility Group 4 in the Victorian Intern Allocation, this being graduates from an overseas campus of an Australian/New Zealand University that is accredited by the Australian Medical Council, they will be following the merit-based process.

Stage 1

Candidates complete their application via the PMV APS. Applications will include:

- General Cover Letter outlining their interest in completing internship in Victoria
- Curriculum Vitae
- Completed Referee Reports
- Video Interview

Stage 2

GV Health will review and rank the candidates by the specified date, in key dates.

Stage 3

The allocation of Group 4 positions will be run utilising a merit algorithm.

Offers

All offers are made subject to the applicant successfully completing all requirements of their medical degree in 2026 and being eligible for provisional registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) in 2026. This includes English language requirements being met for temporary resident candidates successfully matched to GV Health.

Applications will open on Tuesday 5 May 2026 and close on Thursday 4 June 2026. There will be no extensions.

PLEASE NOTE: Under the rules of participation in the Victorian Computer Match, candidates will be unable to accept any position in Victoria other than the position to which they have been matched if they decline a matched position.

Commencement

Compulsory Intern Orientation will be held on Monday 4 January 2027. Intern positions commence the following week commencing Monday 11 January 2027.
